

Health system strengthening	Outcome 1: Rebuilt and strengthened health systems: Infrastructure, HRH management, Procurement and Supply chain management; Outcome 5: Improved sector management and governance; Outcome 6: Improved sustainability of health sector financing
Non-communicable diseases, mental health, substance abuse, road traffic accidents	Outcome 7: Improved healthy lifestyles and environment; Goal indicators: Life lost due to road traffic accidents; Suicide rate per; DALYs lost due to non-communicable and injuries
Communicable diseases – HIV, TB, Malaria, NTD, hepatitis, water-borne diseases	Strategic intervention: Collaborate with other sectors to enforce standards for air, water and food quality; Expand water quality surveillance; DALYs lost due to communicable diseases; Outcome indicator on Immunization coverage to prevent communicable diseases
Universal health coverage	UHC is central focus of the strategic direction and approaches, Chapter 6 outlines – basic health services*, social health protection arrangements, service delivery tier
Women's and children's health	Most of the elements of Basic health service package are targeted to women's and children's health; 6 out of 10 goal indicators and 4 out of 6 outcome (service utilization) are specifically targeted to women's and children's health
Socio-economic determinants of health	Multi-sectoral approach to address socio-economic determinants of health Outcome 7: Improved Healthy Lifestyles and Environment
Addressing health risk factors	Outcome 7: Improved Healthy Lifestyles and Environment
